The new Ranking System published in the last Newsletter resulted in a good deal of feedback from members both positive and negative.

There were also some useful suggestions for the committee to consider and we have, and are, giving them due consideration.

By now, you will have received my letter on behalf of the committee informing you that the Ranking System will be trialled, and not used for selection purposes in the coming season, but that the series of Veterans Open competitions will run as arranged.

As I said in the letter, we have been asked to provide more veteran fencing opportunities for members and it is therefore hoped that you will take part in them.

We are, as I write, finalising the wording of the selection rules to enable members to see exactly how fencers will be selected from the two competitions, and I will send out a further letter, on behalf of the committee, to each of you very shortly.

Finally, the Age Group Qualifier details and entry form will be on the BVF website during the next week, and we look forward to seeing many of you in Bletchley once more.

BVF Gold Stars put Great Britain on top of the World again!

Once again our golden Category C fencers pulled out all the stops to help put Great Britain at the top of the medal table in the 2011 World Veterans Fencing Championships in Poreč, Croatia in September.

Thirty five countries participated with 329 men and 198 women contesting the medals at each of the 18 weapon categories. Our Category C fencers won three gold medals, Janet Cooksey won gold at Foil and Epée and Carol Wengraf won gold at Sabre.

This superb effort was supported by a gold medal from Graham Paul and a silver medal from Brian Causton in Category B Foil. Sylvia Brown, Richard Cohen and Clare Halsted also won silver medals, Sylvia at Category C Sabre, Richard at Category B Sabre and Clare at Category B Foil.

A useful tally of 5 bronze medals from Sylvia Brown Category C Sabre, Kate Elvin Category B Epée, Clare Halsted at Category B Sabre, Bill Osbaldeston Category C Epée and Kate Smith Category A Epée served to reinforce GBR's position.

Altogether our 'Golden Oldies' (Category C) fencers won 6 of the 13 medals won by Great Britain.

Day 1 Wed 28th September

Women's Foil Category A (50-59) – 29 starters

With Caron Hale not present GBR had 3 fencers entered; Debbie Taverner, Jane Clayton and Jenny Morris.

After the round of pools Jenny was seeded 14th, Jane 21st and Debbie was eliminated being last. Jane lost 10/5 to Marx (USA) in the first DE while Jenny missed out on a bronze medal position losing 10/7 to Amari (JPN). Final rankings were J. Morris 6th, J. Clayton 23rd and D. Taverner 29th.

Women's Epée Category B (60-69) – 27 starters

I asked Pat Shepherd-Foster if she would like to substitute for Maggie Myers but she declined.

After the pools Kate Elvin was seeded 3rd, Carole Seheult was 6th and Silvia Earl was eliminated. Both Carole and Kate had a bye to the L16 tableau where Carole put up a good fight but lost 10/9 to Martin (FRA). Kate beat Guatimosim (BRA) 10/9 and then Martin 10/5 to proceed to the quarter-finals. Kate lost 10/5 to the eventual gold medallist Demaille (FRA) to win a Bronze medal
Final Rankings were K. Elvin 3rd, C. Seheult 10th and S. Earl 25th.

Men's Sabre Category C (70+) – 23 starters

GBR had 4 fencers in the event and after the pools both Jim Pilkington and Dennis Hunt were eliminated but Bill Osbaldeston seeded 1st and Allan Ault seeded 5th won byes to the L16 tableau. Allan lost 10/9 to Raveling (GER) but Bill beat Abati (ITA) 10/2 to meet Fine (CAN) in the last 8 to whom Bill lost 10/8. Final rankings were W. Osbaldeston 5th, A. Ault 11th, J. Pilkington 20th and D. Hunt 21st.



Day 2 Thurs 29th September

Women's Foil Category B (60-69) – 26 starters

With Maggie Myers having missed her flight I had asked Pressy Madrangca, on the Wednesday, if she would like to fence in the event. She reluctantly declined because she had booked a trip for the day. With only 3 GBR fencers starting the event we were down to 2 when Silvia Earl was eliminated after the pools. Clare Halsted was seeded 2nd and Kate Harris 14th. Kate lost 10/8 to Ho (CAN) in the first round of DE. Clare who had a bye in the 1st round of DE beat Wuerttemberger (GER) 10/2 then Tanaka (JPN) 10/5 to meet Demaille (FRA) in the Semi-finals. Clare fenced very well to beat Demaille 10/4 but could not overcome Palm (SWE) in the final losing 10/3 but winning a well deserved Silver medal. Final rankings were C. Halsted 2nd, K. Harris 18th and S. Earl 21st.

Men's Sabre Category A (50-59) – 33 starters

After the round of pools our men's sabreurs were seeded Carl Morris 8th, Barry Coulter 11th, Chris Prevett 24th. Anthony Silver was eliminated. In the tableau of 32 Chris beat Pimenau (NED) 10/8 and Carl beat Sato (JPN) 10/6 but Barry Coulter lost to Agapov (RUS) 10/6. Carl and Chris met in the next round where Chris won 10/6. Chris then met the 1st seed and eventual winner Carrara (ITA) to whom he lost 10/4. Final rankings were C. Prevett 8th, C. Morris 13th, B. Coulter 18th and A. Silver 31st.

Women's Epée Category C (70+) – 13 starters

All of our fencer made the cut with Janet Cooksey being seeded 1st, Sylvia Brown 3rd, Carol Wengraf 8th and Connie Adam 10th. Janet and Sylvia won byes to the last 8, Carol defeated Kitami (JPN) 10/8 but Connie lost 10/4 to Haarlem (SWE). In the last 8 Carol and Janet fought for a place in the semi-finals and Janet won 10/6. Sylvia, also fighting for a semi-final place lost 9/8 to Hempelmann (GER). Janet went on to beat Graham (USA) 10/7 in the semi-finals and Hempelmann 10/9 to win her first gold medal of the championships. Final rankings were J. Cooksey 1st, S. Brown 5th, C. Wengraf 8th and C. Adam 10th.

Men's Foil Category B (60-69) - 35 starters

At the end of the round of pools Steve Fox was seeded 1st, Graham Paul was 11th, Brian Causton 20th and Mike Bradbury was eliminated. Graham beat Weisz (CAN) 10/2 and Brian beat Boisco (SUI) 10/1. In the tableau of 16 Steve was knocked out by Takeishi (JPN) 10/7 while Brian beat Loero (ITA) 10/3 and Graham defeated Chubarov (GER) 10/6. Having avoided each other in earlier rounds Brian beat Takeishi 10/5 and Graham beat Sexton III (USA) 10/9 to set up an all British Final. Graham overcame Brian to take the gold medal and Brian the silver. Final Rankings were G. Paul 1st, B. Causton 2nd, S. Fox 9th and M. Bradbury 29th.

Day 3 Fri 30th September

Women's Sabre Category B (60-69) - 18 starters

Pat Shepherd-Foster was eliminated after the round of pools. Silvia Earl was seeded 4th, Vivien Frith was 6th and Clare Halsted 12th. Clare beat Hiatt (USA) 10/7 and Silvia Tachibana (JPN) 10/3. Clare beat Sylvia 10/4 and in the semi-finals had to settle for a bronze medal when she lost 10/5 to O'Leary (USA). Final rankings were C. Halsted 3rd, S. Earl 5th, V. Frith 10th and P. Shepherd-Foster 17th.

Woman's Epée Category A (50-59) – 37 starters

With all 4 of our fencers making the cut Kate Smith was seeded 3rd, Jenny Morris 15th, Jane Clayton 16th and Jane Hutchison 30th. In the first round of DE Jane Hutchison lost to Kate 10/7, Jane Clayton beat Mueller-Brandt (GER) 10/6 and Jenny knocked out Ferdinandy (HUN) 10/5. The next round of DE saw Jane Clayton losing to Chernova (RUS) 10/3 and Jenny losing to Kocab (USA) 10/2 while Kate beat Hoffmann (HUN) 8/4. In the semi-finals Kate lost to Kocab 10/7 having to settle for a bronze medal. Both Jenny and Kate were, under the circumstances, understandably upset. Final rankings were K. Smith 3rd, J. Morris 14th, J. Clayton 15th and J. Hutchison 30th.

Men's Epée Category A (50-59) – 61 starters

Both John Morris and Niall Campbell were eliminated after the pools. Rob Brooks was seeded 17th and Anton Pollard 32nd in the incomplete tableau of 64. Anton was defeated 10/1 by Le Louarn (FRA) but Rob progressed to the last 16 beating Suga (JPN) 10/6 and Feyen (ROU) 10/3. Rob then faced Le Louarn and was beaten 10/4 by the bronze medallist. Final rankings were R. Brooks 11th, A. Pollard 37th, J. Morris 54th and N. Campbell 56th.

Women's Sabre Category C (70+) – 9 starters

This event was started as a poule unique followed by DE. At the end of the poule unique Carol Wengraf was seeded 1st, Silvia Brown 2nd, Connie Adam 4th and Janet Cooksey 5th. The FIE representative intervened and said that there would be no DE and that the result of the poule would stand. The organisers decided to award a bronze medal for the 4th place which pleased Connie no end. Final rankings were C. Wengraf 1st, S. Brown 2nd, C. Adam 4th and J. Cooksey 5th.

Day 4 Sat 1st October

Men's Epée Category B (60-69) – 50 starters

All of our fencers made the cut at the end of the round of pools. Ralph Johnson was seeded 2nd, Robin Davenport 21st, Graham Paul 24th and Lawrence Burr 33rd. In the incomplete tableau of 64 Ralph, Graham and Robin had byes but Lawrence lost to Van Der Grinten (NED) 10/7. In the tableau of 32 Ralph beat Buongiardino (ITA) 10/0, Graham beat Cochrane (USA) 10/8 and Robin beat Goosens (FRA) 3/2. None of our fencers progressed to the tableau of 8 Graham losing Syrovatco (UKR) 6/5, Robin lost to Ringeissen (FRA) 10/8 and Ralph lost to Beekhuizen (NED) 10/7. Final rankings were R. Johnson 10th, R. Davenport 12th, G. Paul 13th and L. Burr 34th.

Men's Epée Category C (70+) – 29 starters

None of our fencers were eliminated after the pools. Bill Osbaldeston was seeded 8th, Robert Phelps was 12th, Bob Turner was 20th and Nigel Hinchliff 21st. Bill received a bye to the last 16 but Bob was beaten by Shinki (JPN) 10/4 and Nigel knocked out Rob Phelps 10/3. Bill beat Boschetto (ITA) 4/3 and Nigel beat Bucher (SUI) 10/3 to make it to the quarter finals. Bill defeated Boitel (FRA) 10/8 but Nigel lost to Adams (USA) 10/5 who went on to defeat Bill 4/3 in the semi finals.

Final rankings were W. Osbaldeston 3rd, N. Hinchliff 8th, R. Phelps 17th and R. Turner 21st.

Women's Sabre Category A (50-59) – 24 starters

Yvonne Walls was eliminated after the round of pools. Jane Hutchison was seeded 8th, Jenny Morris was 12th and Jane Clayton was equal 15th. In the first round of DE Jane Hutchison and Jenny had byes but Jane Clayton lost to Reguigne (FRA) 10/4. In the last 16 Jane Hutchison beat Bousquet (FRA) 10/7 but Jenny was knocked out by Runyan (USA) 8/3. Jane was beaten by the gold medal winner Janshen (GER) 10/4.

Final rankings were J. Hutchison 8th, J. Morris 12th, J. Clayton 18th and Y. Walls 22nd.

Women's Foil Category C (70+) – 15 starters

Janet Cooksey emerged from the round of pools seeded 1st, Sylvia Brown was 5th and Diane Austin was 10th. Ann Cornwall was eliminated. Janet received a bye to the last 8 and Sylvia defeated Tissier (FRA) 10/4 to join her. Diane lost 10/5 to Maier (USA). Sylvia then lost to Saracino (GER) but Janet beat Saracino 10/9 to gain the final where she won the gold medal beating Gorius (GER) 10/4.

Final rankings were J. Cooksey 1st, S. Brown 5th, D. Austin 10th and A. Cornwall 14th.

Men's Foil Category A (50-59) – 47 starters

With Paul Lowen injured we only had 3 fencers in the event. John Troiano was seeded 3rd, Nick Fihosy 28th and Richard Sage 34th after the pools. John had a bye in the incomplete tableau of 64 but Nick lost 10/9 to Lee (IRL) and Richard lost 10/9 to Campiche (SUI). John went on to defeat Ojeda (ESP) 10/5 and then Engelhard (GER) 10/6 to reach the last 8 where he was knocked out by Blaschka (AUT) 9/3.

Final rankings were J. Troiano 6th, N. Fihosy 33rd and R. Sage 35th.

Men's Sabre Category B (60-69) – 31 starters

Steve Fox was eliminated after the round of pools. Richard Cohen was seeded 2nd, Richard Bonehill equal 10th and Mike Compton 21st. Richard Cohen won a bye to the last 16 but in the incomplete tableau of 32 Mike was defeated 10/7 by Bocconi (ITA). Richard Bonehill joined Richard Cohen in the last 16 by beating Anastosov (MKD) 10/3. Bonehill was unable to progress to the last 8 being knocked out by Nagy (HUN) 10/9. Cohen beat Curro (ITA) 10/7 then Nagy 10/5 and Seuss (USA) 10/5 to get to the final where he lost 10/7 to Yung (USA). Final rankings were R. Cohen 2nd, R. Bonehill =11th, M. Compton 21st and S. Fox 25th.

Alan was knocked out in the tableau of 16 by Aftandilov (RUS) 10/1 and Jim by Hojer (GER) 10/3. Final rankings were J. Pilkington 15th, A. Ault 16th, H. de Silva 17th and D. Ward 19th.

Our two referees Lynne Melia and Duncan Rowlands comported themselves well both on and off the piste. They were a credit to British Fencing and BVF. Lynne Melia was given a foil final to referee. Both of our referees were an asset to the GBR Delegation.

I saw quite a bit of the fencing and one thing that impressed me greatly was the superiority of the footwork from some of the other nations' fencers when compared to ours.

Although there were a few gallant GBR fencers supporting our competitors, I thought that the team spirit was not as good as in previous years. It really helps our fencers when there is support for them when fencing and the pleasure of being presented with a medal is enhanced when one's squad members are there to cheer and celebrate the success.
