23/25 Treasurer's Report

The Winton Cup made a small profit. Last year it made a loss because two teams did not pay in full, but this year everyone paid in full.

World Championships – The team manager's costs remain to be settled, but overeall the event will need a BVF subsidy of about £700, similar to last year.

World Championships' psychology and refereeing seminars are yet to be calculated.

The Bards Bash was cost neutral to BVF.

German match - as agreed we paid £50 to everyone who attended.

Entries are rolling in for Guildford. Medals have been ordered and paid for.

Expenses policy yet to be finalised.

Deposit paid to the Manchester Fencing Centre for the Nationals 2024.

Harvey Haddon Centre booked for the Age Groups 2024.

23/26 Competitions

23/26.1 World Championships

GA had circulated a report to the Committee (see Appendix).

There were initial problems with weapons control, but these were quickly ironed out.

GA and the committee congratulated CM and JH on their double medals.

The next WC have been awarded to Dubai, but might be elsewhere in the Emirates. No dates have been set yet.

23/26.2 **Winton Cup**

No venue or date has been agreed. Lilleshall can only do 30 Aug/1 September which is the weekend students go to university which might affect participation or 5/6 October which is too close to the WC.

Marcia (MS) has approached RAF Cosford but this is a big risk as they have the right to cancel. LW suggested the National Sports Centre in Cardiff. LW to follow up with Lyn Robinson. Post meeting note: this venue is not available.

Edgbaston University was suggested for one of the last two weekends in September. LW to contact them.

23/26.3 Royal Navy Match

CM has been contacted regarding a match between BVF, Royal Holloway and the Royal Navy at HMS President on 26 November.

CM and GP to liaise on this matter once further information has been obtained. GP/CM

23/26.4 Guildford International

GP is responsible for the organisation of this competition.

More will need to be spent this year on equipment as last year was supplied free of charge by Welsh Fencing and this kit is no longer available. Pete Huggins is providing boxes, but roll out pistes are required. KA to check whether Sussex has any.

GP was concerned about getting people to help set up and take down. It was suggested that pizza could be offered to helpers. GP to contact fencers directly who have helped in the past. GP Entries close on 1 December. LW to arrange with John Mason a method of collecting late entries at an increased price of an additional £20.

Joe Pearce is organising referees.

CM suggested drawing up a checklist for competition organisers to help keep track of tasks. CM

23/26.5 Nationals

KA is responsible for the organisation of this competition.

23/26.6 **Age Groups**

There was a brief discussion about which format to use for this competition. CM thought this was such an important issue that a special meeting should be held to discuss just this point and to make a final decision about it. LW to arrange a date for a meeting.

ND had sent an update on progress:

Venue is booked; Mike Robinson running DT; Pete and Janet Huggins can provide 16 pistes worth of equipment and armoury services; remainder of equipment to be hired from Leon Paul. ND to contact Dave Sweeney re medical cover and PB re budget. Referees, entry form and accommodation remain outstanding.

MS/WS Grand Veteran event scheduled for the Friday afternoon and rest of events over the weekend.

23/26.7 Summer Nationals veteran event

CM had been contacted by Georgina Usher regarding a proposal to run a veteran competition at the BF Nationals and for this to be an EVF Circuit competition.

Various reservations were expressed, such as the complications of running it in Age Group format to comply with EVF requirements, potential future pressure for it to replace the BVF Nationals and the possibility that, as an EVF circuit event it might impact upon Guildford participation. Although CM did state that Georgina had reassured him that the EVF President had told her if it did run next year it would only be as a one off. The Committee hoped it would be well supported but wondered whether there would be enough interest to make the competition successful and thought possibly it might work better as an epee event, due to the larger numbers.

After a long discussion the Committee decided that they certainly had no objections to British Fencing running the event.

23/26.8 European Teams

This competition will take place on the week beginning Thursday 9 May in Cigney Belgium. The Selection Policy for this event has been published and will use the Nationals 2023 as part of the selection process.

23/26.9 Bard's Bash

A date needs to be fixed but will depend on availability of Chris Buxton and the venue. JH to contact Chris to find out availability. 20/21 July a favoured date.

23/26.10 German Match

This event takes place every two years, so is next due to take place in the UK in 2025. The Committee had considered including a third team, but it was felt that a smaller competition allowed for a friendlier atmosphere and kept costs down. This year in Germany there was a poule match in the afternoon and other local fencers were invited. This could be a consideration for 2025.

23/27 Selection

A mistake had been made in the selection of a replacement fencer in Mens Foil Cat 3 for the World Championships. This was due to an error by the Chair of Selectors who has apologised to the fencer who should have been offered the place. This fencer has asked for a confirmation of the procedure for replacement fencers. It was confirmed that the procedure is that the relevant weapon selector makes his selection and notifies the Chair of Selectors of his selection in writing. This is ratified and the relevant fencer contacted and offered the place. It was agreed that CM write to confirm this procedure with the affected fencer and for GP to contact another fencer who felt aggrieved.

23/28 **Communication**

There was a discussion about the Veteran Fencers Chat Facebook group, which was set up by GA as an informal discussion group. This group has become very large and successful attracting veteran fencers from all over the world. Unfortunately, this now makes it an unsuitable platform for BVF members to discuss contentious topics concerning BVF, as their comments are now open to a huge audience. It was decided to set up a BVF Facebook group just for BVF members to provide a platform where BVF business can be discussed amongst its members. LW was asked to set up a group with CM also having access.

23/29 Initiatives

JH thought that we should be offering more to our members in return for their annual membership fee. She suggested setting up Zoom webinars on topics such as armoury, refereeing, strength and conditioning, nutrition, running competitions etc. It was agreed to investigate this further.

23/30 British Fencing Advanced Development Programme

KA explained that British Fencing has a whole programme set up to develop elite fencers and that maybe veteran fencers could also be supported by this programme.

KA was asked to liaise with Steve Kemp to find out whether there was a way for veteran fencers to tap into the programme.

23/31 Henry de Silva's birthday

The Committee decided to mark Henry's 90th birthday by sending him a card and present and to ask Malcolm Fare to produce an article on Henry to be published on BVF website and social media and to pass on to BF for their news.

CM reported that Henry had offered to run the Veteran Commonwealth Championships in the Isle of Man next year as no country has stepped up to run them. CM to pass this offer on to the Commonwealth Championships Committee.

LW asked whether the Hampshire Open could use the BVF entry system for Hampshire Veteran Open entries in 2024. This was agreed.

Veterans Fencing World Championships 2023 Daytona Beach, Florida GBR Summary

The Veterans Fencing World Championship were held at Daytona Beach, Florida, USA from $11^{th}-16^{th}$ October. It was a good venue and location, efficiently run, and the friendliness was excellent. The schedule was different from previous Championships -2 weapons per day (all categories) with the corresponding team events the following day, and for individual events, two waves of finals and medal presentations. The standard of refereeing was excellent with live stream and video refereeing from the L8 onwards. The GBR squad comprised of 59 fencers, with a total of 72 individual weapon entries and 6 team entries, plus 3 privately funded coaches, 16 supporters and the Team Manager.
