He then lost 3-10 to BEONIO BROCCIERI (ITA), coming away with a well earned and deserved bronze medal. This was the final event of the day with 6 GBR fencers entered in a total of 13. After the poules our girls ranked 1-5 and 7, but their fortunes were then mixed. Lynne BORNEMISZA met Bath Sword Club team mate Sue BENNEY winning 10-9 to take her into the semi-finals where she lost 5-10 to gold medallist GARDINI (ITA). Yvonne WALLS and Vivien FRITH met in the other semi-final with Viv winning 10-8. With only 3 GBR fencers all in their first individual Vets international in an entry of 73 the pressure was on. Georgina USHER in a league of her own, ranking 1st after the poules with a bye in the L128 sailed through the DEs with scores of 10-3, 10-2, 10-4, 10-7 to reach the semi-finals where she defeated MILANOLI (ITA) 10-4, to fence in the final. In another lesson on how to fence epee and win, she convincingly defeated HABLUTZEL-BURKI (SUI) 10-5 to take GOLD. A fantastic start to her international Vets career. Nicola HULL, after a bye and then a 10-2 win in the L64, went out in the L32 4-10 to NEUHAUS (GER). Marie MATHESON also went out in the L64, after a 10-8 win in the L128, 5-10 to DUVAL (FRA). Sue lost 3-10 in the L32 to FISCHER (GER) whilst Jenny moved into L16 defeating YURCHENKO (RUS) 10-9. Andy fencing bravely with a painful shoulder injury which needed medical attention between bouts was unfortunate to draw Richard in the L32, losing 5-10. In a very close and exciting match Richard won 10-9 on the last hit and went on to fence BELLET (ITA) in the semi-final losing 7-10 but winning BRONZE. The final results were:

On the first day the Foil and Sabre Teams took up the cudgels. England Women's Foil Team of Caron Hale, Kate O'Connell and Susan Uff won all of their matches getting the England Squad off to a good start. England's Women's Epée Team of Janet Baron, Caron Hale and Valerie Young lost to Scotland.

In the second round both England's Epée Teams faced Ireland where the Women's Team lost but the Men's Team won. In the final round, with everything to play for both of England's Epée teams were victorious over Wales and retained the Justin Smith Trophy for the 7th year in a row.

There was a good team spirit among the England Squad, with each of the teams not fencing supporting those on the piste. Everyone enjoyed the experience and camaraderie, none more so than the new members of the England Team. Well done England, again!

'Rodney and I met on holiday in Newquay when we were about 7, where it happened that his parents owned the hotel at which we were staying on holiday and he lived about a mile away from my home. We got on and met again when he returned home. He later went away to prep and public schools but we would meet up during the holidays. This was usually at his house (where the photo was taken) as there was little room for play at our shop which was in a row of terraced houses. We lost touch when time came to go the college/uni, meeting again once more a few years later and then when he took up fencing and began to take part in vets events. So we didn't see each other for the best part of 40 years until 2006.'
