The Vets Team Challenge Loughborough 15th October 2006

Earlier this year, at an NVA Committee meeting in July and with the World Championships just 2 months away, it was agreed that an annual tournament needed to be organised with the non-international fencing members very much in mind.

As Match Secretary, I was pleased to do this, and even more pleased when new committee member Linda Lawes volunteered to help me.

Right from the start, we decided that the competition would be over three weapons, with mixed teams of 3 at each weapon, and at a venue centrally placed in England.

The Loughborough Leisure Centre turned out to be just right and at an affordable price for this inaugural event.

The biggest problem was organising individual members into teams, as members are spread across the UK, and although we had a number who filled in their forms as individuals, a large number of telephone calls were needed before we were able to put together four teams for the day.

On the morning of the event, the biggest challenge facing the fencers, many of whom were meeting for the first time, was to decide on a team name.

The Best Christmas Present Ever!!

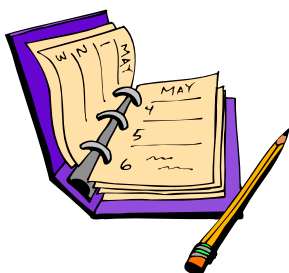
Due to extensive public demand we hear from Richard Bonehill that he is presently putting together the 'all singing all dancing' DVD of the Bath World Championships.
